The 14th Meeting of Academic Council commenced with Hon'ble Vice Chancellor welcoming all the members present and apprising them in brief about the issues that need to be deliberated upon. This being the first meeting of the 3rd Academic Council of Central University of Gujarat after being reconstituted, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor welcomed the new nominated members and the other faculty of CUG who were inducted as members of the 3rd Academic Council, both ex-officio as well as by seniority on rotation and requested all the members to introduce themselves to the House for the purposes of acquaintance.

Thereafter, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor apprised the House about the various academic, outreach, extension, programmes undertaken and curricular, co-curricular and cultural events organised by the University since the previous meeting of Academic Council. Notable among them were the ranking of Central University of Gujarat under National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) under which CUG has been ranked 60th on all India basis, 2nd among the Universities in Gujarat and 2nd among the newly established Central Universities. He further apprised the members about accreditation of the University with B⁺⁺ Grade by NAAC, GIAN Programmes conducted by the University, signing of MoU with Beijing Foreign Studies University and Jinan University by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor during his visit to China as a member of Academic Delegation accompanying Hon'ble Visitor, the President of India on his State Visit to Peoples' Republic of China, signing of MoU with National Council for Promotion of Sindhi Language(NCPSL), University of Tasmania, Australia, Bhasha Adivasi Academy, and many other important MoUs that are in the pipeline. He also informed the members that the University has been active and vibrant with various Conferences, Seminars, Workshops, Training Programmes and Celebration of Commemoration Days like International Woman's Day, Human Rights Day, Vigilance Week, Annual Day, Constitution Day, National Integration Day, Dr. Ambedkar Jayanti, Gandhi Jayanti, National Unity Day, Hindi Pakhwada, International Yoga Day and the like. With these introductory remarks he suggested to the Registrar to take up the Agenda for deliberation.

The Registrar, while thanking the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor for his introductory remarks welcomed the Hon'ble Members of Academic Council once again on behalf of the University and with the permission of the Chair placed the Agenda before the House.

The Dean, SLL&CS was of the opinion that the students must be given separate marks cards for graduation and post-graduation so that they can avail advantage depending on their need. The Academic Council discussed about the proposed intake for various courses this year. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor explained to the House that in view of paucity of academic space, student accommodation and the UGC regulations restricting the intake of M.Phil and Ph.D. students per supervisor and also as per the decision taken in the meeting of Deans and Chairpersons the University would restrict the intake to feasible and viable limits and admissions to M.Sc course in Nano Science and M.Ed course with approval of NCTE will be taken up for the first time.

The House approved the proposal and authorized Hon'ble Vice Chancellor to take decisions, he deems fit in admission matters at the time of notification as well as at the time of admissions.

Resolution: 23: (3)

Dr. Sanjeev Kumar Dubey explained to the House the rationale behind the resolution. **The House approved issuing a Certificate to this effect, suffixing it as "with amendments as approved by the Academic Council of CUG".**

Hon'ble Vice Chancellor was of the opinion that since the Examination Manual is an important document, it needs to be carefully looked into and elicit inputs in the form of additions, deletions and modifications based on the views of Hon'ble Members. Further, the amendments proposed to Ordinance No. 14, dealing with award of Graduate and Post-Graduate degrees through item 23(5) and 23 (6) need to be look into carefully. Hence, he suggested that the members may submit their comments, suggestions and observations on the Examination Manual and amendments to Ordinance No. 14 within a week's time to the Registrar to enable the University to take decision on these issues.

The House approved the resolution moved by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor and authorized him to initiate needful action in the light of the observations and suggestions received from the members.

The vacancies notified and filled.

The Committee constituted for reviewing the Academic Ordinances as per the UGC regulations is looking into the matter.

Pursuant to the resolution of the Executive Council to upgrade the Centre for Nano Sciences and Centre for Library and Information Science as Schools, the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor in exercise of power vested in him under Central Universities Act, 2009 vide Section 5(1) has appointed Prof. T.

Bagchi and Prof. K. Muttayya as Dean of School of Nano Sciences and School of Library and Information Science respectively.

The appointment of Deans is brought to the notice of the House for information.

Resolution No 10:

The House noted the appointment of Deans to the new Schools while congratulating them who were present in the House as members.

Item No.11/14/AC/06.03.2017

To note the format and specimen of Degrees Certificates of CUG.

The Ordinance No. 22 of the University relating to Convocation has been assented by the Hon'ble Visitor and the University proposes to hold its first Convocation shortly. Since, the University is required to issue degree certificates to those who have successfully completed their respective courses, the University has evolved a specimen Degree certificate with format, content and security features as per requirements. The Specimen Degree certificates were submitted to Executive Council in its meeting held on 05.01.2017 and the EC has approved the Specimen Degree Certificates to be issued to the graduates of the Central University of Gujarat.

Hence, the specimen Degree Certificate is placed before the Academic Council for perusal and endorsement.

Resolution No 11:

The Hon'ble Members of the Academic Council discussed at length about the content and format of the Degree Certificate. Some of the Members suggested to include the name of the Centres and Schools whereas some of the Members were not in favour of including the same as the Degree Certificate is always issued by the University and not by the individual Schools/ Centre and also the nomenclature of Schools and Centres may change from time to time. Some of the Members had also suggested that the percentage should be mentioned along with Grade and CGPA.

The members perused the specimen degree certificate of the University to be issued hereafter. The members discussed about whether to include the name of the School/Centre of the candidate, whether to include the name of the parents and whether to include percentage along with CGPA or not. From the deliberations that followed, it appeared that most of the members were in favour of mentioning only the discipline or subject since the nomenclature of School and Centre could be amended from time to time, leading to confusion regarding degree certificate issued at a particular point of time. Likewise, the House was in favour of including the name of the candidate only and only CGPA without percentage, because the percentage of marks can be made out from the marks card issued at the end of every semester. However, in view of no unanimous opinion having been arrived at through deliberations, the House authorised Hon'ble Vice Chancellor to take an appropriate decision in the matter.

Item No.12/14/AC/06.03.2017

To ratify the submission of Annual Report of CUG for the year 2015-16 to MHRD for laying it in both the Houses of Parliament

As per the Central Universities Act 2009, Section 30(3), a copy of the Annual Report prepared as provided under Sub-Section (1), shall be submitted to the Central Government, which shall, as soon as may be, cause the same to be laid before both Houses of Parliament. Accordingly, the bilingual Annual Report for the year 2015-16 prepared by the Central University of Gujarat incorporating the suggestions made by the Hon'ble members of the Court in its last meeting, was submitted to the Ministry of Human Resource Development, GOI for arranging it to be placed before both the houses of Parliament.

In view of the term of 2nd Academic Council of Central University of Gujarat having expired and the 3rd Executive Council due for constitution, the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, exercising powers vested in him under Section 11 (3) of the Central Universities Act, approved the Annual Report for submission to the Ministry pending approval of Academic Council, especially since the Winter Session of Parliament having been rescheduled to commence from 16th November 2016 and directive received from the Ministry to submit the Annual Report on or before 11th November, 2016.

The House is requested to ratify the action taken by the University with regard to submission of Annual Report 2015-16 to the Ministry of Human Resource Development for laying it in both the Houses of Parliament.

Resolution No 12:

The Registrar explained to the House the circumstances that led to the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor exercising powers vested in him under Section 11(3) of the Central Universities Act, 2009, and approve the Annual Report for the year 2015-16 to be sent to the Ministry of HRD for laying it in both the Houses of Parliament.

The Academic Council noted the action taken by the University for submission of Annual Report 2015-16 to the Ministry of HRD for laying it before both the Houses of Parliament and while approving the Annual Report post facto, ratified the action taken by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor.

Item No.13/14/AC/06.03.2017

To ratify Creation of Supernumerary Seats to Jammu & Kashmiri Students for admission to various academic programmes of the University.

The Ministry of Human Resource Development vide its letter No.15-17/2015-NS1 dated 8th July, 2016 and UGC letters of even number dated 19th October, 2012, 8th September, 2014, 10th March,

2015 and 23d June, 2015 has suggested creation of 2 seats under Supernumerary Quota for students from Jammu & Kashmir. The Ministry of Human Resource Development had decided that two Supernumerary seats will be made available to the students of Jammu & Kashmir who seek admission through centralised counselling in Universities/Colleges approved under Section 2(1) and 12 B of the UGC Act or recognised by AICTE and have at least one NBA approved course.

The University has adopted and implemented the directions of the UGC/MHRD in letter and spirit and has implemented it w.e.f. the Academic Year 2016-17. Hence the action taken is placed before the Academic Council for ratification.

Resolution 13:

The Registrar informed the members about the directives received from Ministry and the UGC for creation of supernumerary seats to Jammu and Kashmir students in admissions to various courses in all centrally funded institutions and CUG being one of such Institutions, it was obligatory to comply with these directives. Accordingly, the University has implemented these directives during the admissions for the academic year 2016-17 for which the admission process took place in June-July 2016.

The House having noted the routine procedure of implementation of UGC and MHRD directives pending approval of University Authorities, unanimously ratified the action taken by the University in creating supernumerary seats for Jammu and Kashmiri students.

Item No.14/14/AC/06.03.2017

To ratify various MoUs signed by the University.

The University has entered into the Memorandum of Understanding with the following Universities/institutions in last one year.

1. MoU signed on 12.04.2016 with the National Council for Promotion of Sindhi Language by the University.
2. MoU with Beijing Foreign Studies University, Beijing, China for promotion of education and academic exchange in academic programs faculty and administrative staff, academics materials and for jointly exploring research and other scholarly activities.
3. MoU with Jinan University, Guangzhou, China to Promote educational and academic exchange.
4. The University signed an MoU with the Directorate General of Military Training (DGMT) M-15, Integrated HQ of MoD (Army), New Delhi on 13th October, 2016 for offering admission to PG Programmes in Chinese language and culture for serving Army Officers on deputation.
5. The School of Language, Literature and Culture Studies of the University has signed a MoU with Bhasha Adivasi Academy, Tejgadh, Gujarat on 13th December 2016 for undertaking joint research in the areas of tribal culture, language and amelioration of tribal population in the State of Gujarat and adjoining States.

These Memoranda of Understanding signed by the University are placed before the Academic Council for ratification.

Resolution 14:

Various MoUs signed by the University were explained by the Registrar and the faculty members who are coordinating these MoUs were invited to explain the salient features, major initiatives, relevance and benefits that would accrue to the University out of these MoUs. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor apprised the House about the signing of MoU by him with Beijing Foreign Studies University, Beijing, Jinan University, Guangzhou, China in the presence of Hon'ble President of India during his visit to China as a member of academic delegation accompanying Hon'ble President of India on his State Visit to Peoples' Republic of China.

The Registrar further apprised the House that several important MoUs are in the pipeline like the ones with University of Florida, USA, National Environmental Engineering Research Institute (NEERI), Nagpur, Sun Pharma Ltd., Baroda, National Council for Rural Institutes (NCRI), Hyderabad, Bhabha Atomic Research Centre (BARC), Mumbai, Bhaskaracharya Institute of Space Applications and Geo-Informatics, and the like.

The House, while appreciating the efforts made by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor and the faculty in establishing linkages for collaborative research of applied nature and providing opportunities for academically enriching and rewarding experiences through exchange programmes, ratified the MoUs signed by the University and hoped that the MoUs in pipeline will come through for further enhancement of relevance, stature and image of the University.

The Registrar and the Controller of Examination explained to the members the cases of students wherein extension of time for submission of M.Phil. dissertation and Ph.D. thesis was granted on the recommendation of the respective Schools and Centres. In all 15 students were granted extension of time to complete their M.Phil. and Ph.D. Programmes from School of Chemical Sciences, School of Language Literature and Culture Studies, Centre for Studies and Research in Diaspora, School of Life Sciences, School of International Studies and School of Environment and Sustainable Development.

The Academic Council having found the extension granted as deserving, ratified the action taken by the University.

Item No.16/14/AC/06.03.2017

To ratify adoption of latest Regulations of University Grants Commission: UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for Award of M.Phil./Ph.D. Degrees) Regulations, 2016.

The University Grants Commission vide its Gazette Notification dated 5th May, 2016 has notified the latest Amendments to its Regulations relating to the Award of M.Phil. and Ph.D. Degrees by the Universities recognized by the UGC, which will come into force with immediate effect. These Regulations being mandatory in nature and obligatory on the part of all the Universities including the Central Universities, the Central University of Gujarat has adopted the provisions of these amended Regulations with immediate effect. Necessary amendments are being brought to the Ordinances of the Central University of Gujarat governing award of M.Phil. and Ph.D. Degrees by the Regulations and Statutes Review Committee to incorporate the amendments notified by the UGC.

The Executive Council of CUG in its meeting held on 05.01.2017 has approved the proposed amendments to the Ordinance of the University for incorporating the provisions of the latest UGC

Regulations governing award of M.Phil. and Ph.D. Degrees. Hence the same is placed before the Academic Council for ratification.

Resolution 16:

The Registrar apprised the House about the adoption of the latest Regulations published by the UGC in the Gazette of India dated 5th May, 2017. The CUG being an autonomous Institution fully funded by the UGC it is mandatory and obligatory for it to comply with all Academic and Administrative Regulations issued with amendments from time to time by the UGC. He informed the House, that the Executive Council in its meeting held on 05/01/2017 had approved the adoption and implementation of these Regulations and amendments proposed to the CUG Ordinances for such incorporation.

The House having acknowledged the need for adoption of UGC Regulations and suitable amendments required to be made in the relevant Ordinance of CUG, ratified the adoption of UGC Regulations and amendments proposed to the CUG Ordinances.

Item No.17/14/AC/06.03.2017

To recommend and approve co-option of four (04) Members to the Academic Council of Central University of Gujarat as per the provisions of Statute-13.

As per the Statute 13 pertaining to the Constitution of the Academic Council, the House has to co-opt four persons who are not in the service of the University as members of Academic Council for their special knowledge. Hence the matter is placed before the Academic Council for co-option of four persons as members of the 3rd Academic Council of CUG.

Resolution 17:

The Registrar apprised the House that the Academic Council will have to co-opt four persons as the members of Academic Council for their special knowledge who are not in the service of the University as per Section XIV of the Statute 13 of the University relating to constitution of Academic Council and requested the House to propose the names of such academicians. The House after deliberations proposed with consensus the names of:

1. Prof. U. B. Bhoite, Former Vice Chancellor, Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University, Nasik, Former Vice Chancellor, Bharti Vidyapeeth, Pune and President of Indian Sociological Society,
2. Prof. M. Muniyamma, Former Vice Chancellor, Gulbarga University, Gulbarga, Former Member of Karnataka Knowledge Commission, Karnataka State Higher Education Council and University Review Commission, Govt. of Karnataka.
3. Dr. Shashi Bala Singh, Director General, Life Sciences(LS), Defense Research and Development Organization(DRDO), New Delhi.

The Members suggested that the fourth co-opted member could be from outside the University System so as to guide and advise the University in University and Industry/Society Interface, which is being emphasized of late, by the Hon'ble Visitor, the

Ministry and the UGC. Accordingly, the House proposed co-option of Dr. Chandraprakash Dwivedi, the renowned Media Person and acclaimed TV Documentary Producer, which was unanimously endorsed.

The Members approved the co-option of the above members known for their special knowledge and authorised the University to issue notification of co-option of the above members.

Item No.18/14/AC/06.03.2017

To consider and approve establishment of Chair of Excellence in the proposed School of National Security Studies

The University has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Director General of Military Training, MT-15. IHQ of Ministry of Defence (MoD) (Army) New Delhi. Further, based on the discussion the senior officials of defence services with Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor held on 23rd December 2016, Lt. Col. Shri S.S. Singh, GSO-1, MT-15, vide his letter No. A/85166/4/GS/MT-15, addressed to the Registrar, Central University of Gujarat (CUG), has proposed for establishment of 'Chair of Excellence' in Defence Studies for a tenure of 3 years with endowment from Indian Army and contribution from Central University of Gujarat towards remuneration and other facilities. The Central University of Gujarat is one of the six institutions in the country identified by the UGC for establishment of School of National Security Studies for which it has sanctioned 1.88 Cr. for the academic year 2016-17 for which the CUG has submitted action plan including creation of teaching and non-teaching posts. Further, the University has already submitted a proposal to the UGC and MHRD for upgradation of Centre for Security Studies as the School of National Security Studies with a plan of action incorporating the courses to be offered and advanced research to be carried out in different areas of National Security and Defence Research. In view of the above, the proposal to establish the Chair of Excellence in Defence Studies would prove to be beneficial in the long run in CUG emerging as a Centre of Excellence in Defence and Security Studies.

Hence, the proposal to establish a Chair of Excellence in Defence Studies at Central University of Gujarat with endowment from Ministry of Defence is placed before the House for consideration and approval.

Resolution 18:

The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor apprised the House about the salient features and the advantages of establishing a Chair of Excellence in Defence and Security Studies which could stand the University in good stead in emerging as the most sought after destination for studies and research in Defence and Strategic Studies in the Country. He invited Dr. Sanjay Jha, Dean, SIS to explain the programmes and modus operandi of the Chair. Dr. Sanjay Jha explained in detail about the proposed Chair.

The House having been convinced about the relevance and utility of the said Chair and its potential to emerge as a flagship programme in the years to come, approved the

establishment of Chair of Excellence in Defence and Security Studies in the proposed School of National Security Studies at Central University of Gujarat.

Resolution 23:

The Registrar informed the House about the Constitution of the Ordinances and Statutes Review Committee, with mandate to look into and revise the existing Ordinances to incorporate amendments notified by the Regulatory Authorities from time to time and evolve/frame new Ordinances as per requirement of the University. The Dean, Student Welfare has forwarded the draft guidelines (placed at next pages) for the consideration and approval of the Academic Council for implementation from the AY 2017-18.

The House is requested to consider the guidelines on admission under Sports quota.

Sports Quota Admission: For admission under sports quota, a student must have a secure places and participation in the National / Inter-State competition or above or secured position 1st / 2nd / 3rd for individual event / sports or member of Champion / Runners up team for team event/sports/games in Inter-Dist (open) competition recognized by the competent authorities in the A.I.U listed sports and games with percentage of marks and having participation & position 1st / 2nd in the Zonal Inter-University competition or having Participation & position 1st / 2nd / 3rd in the All India/ Inter-Zonal Inter-University competition in the AIU (www.aiuweb.org) conducted events sports/games with percentage of marks/rank as fixed by the concerned faculty at qualifying examination for PG level courses of the university where graduation is minimum qualification. For chess, applicant having the FIDE rating 1700 and above along with the criteria specified above and for Tennis, applicant having the AITA ranking up to 300 for under 18 years boys/girls or ranking up to 500 for open (Men/Women) category is eligible to apply for admission under the sports quota. Such sports representations for UG or PG courses are to be made in the current year one of the two preceding years (calendar year) only.

Qualification Criteria-

Fifty marks are for the trials and 50 for the winning and participation certificates. *A student has to get minimum 25 marks in the trials to get admission under sports quota.*

Direct admission without trial-

Sports person who have participated / represented the country in the following competitions.

- Olympic Games,
- Asian Games,
- World Championships,
- Commonwealth Games, S.A.F Games and Afro Asian Games
- Paralympic Games (Recognized / affiliated by IOC and / or MYAS)

Weightage

A weightage of 50% shall be given to the certificate/achievement of the candidate's best performance of the last three years as submitted by student and weightage of 50% shall be given on field trial.

Test

There would be a two level test. First, a fitness test. A certificate would be given to those students who qualify. This would be followed by trials.

Admission based on Sports Trials

- Maximum 50 marks for Sports Certificates as per the chart enclosed.
- It is essential for the candidate to qualify any two of the following Fitness Test items as per the standards laid down by the University (for general fitness) :

Maximum 50 marks for Sports Trials includes general fitness, skill test, game performance test, game specific fitness, fundamentals of the game/sports etc.

Applicant shall produce the relevant certificate to prove District representation.

The following guidelines shall be followed in determining merits in sports for admission to the UG programmes. Marks shall be awarded to the 1st (Winner or the Winning Team), Second (Runner up or Runner up team), third (third place) and participation as mention below:

Resolution 26:

Realising the importance of Sports for the personality development of students and the standards of sports performance of the University, the House unanimously approved the admissions under Sports Quota in Schools and Centres of the University w.e.f. the AY 2017-18. The House further authorised the Admissions Committee to incorporate this Provision in the University Prospectus from this year onwards.

Item No.27/14/AC/06.03.2017

To consider and approve the commencement of Admission process for the AY 2017-18.

The University has requested all the Deans and Chairperson to furnish the details with regard to vacancies in M.Phil. – Ph.D. Programmes as per the UGC Regulations in force. Based on the information furnished by the respective Deans and Chairperson, the University will issue, if ordinances are approved, admission notification and commence the admission process for various PG and M.Phil./Ph.D. and for standalone Ph.D. programmes for the AY 2017-18.

The House is requested to consider and approve the intake for various programmes as proposed by the respective School/Centre Heads for the AY 2017-18.

Resolution 27:

Hon'ble Vice Chancellor apprised the House about the need for commencing the Admission process for the Academic Year 2017-18 on time and brought to the notice of the House that this year also the University will conduct Online Entrance Examinations on all India basis following the latest UGC Regulations for Admission to M.Phil. and Ph.D. Programme which have been adopted and implemented by the University with immediate effect. The Registrar informed the House that School/Centre wise and faculty wise vacancies for M.Phil.-Ph.D. Programme have been identified by obtaining information from all the Schools and Centres which could be used in preparing the Admission Notification with updating wherever required.

The House approved the commencement of admission process for the academic year 2017-18 and authorizing the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor to initiate any action he deems necessary in completing the process of admissions for the year 2017-18.

Item No.28/14/AC/06.03.2017

To recommend nominations for School Board and Centre Board of Studies as per Ordinance.

Recommendation for nominations by Academic Council is required as per Ordinance No.6 and Ordinance No.7, provisions of which are reproduced below:

As per the Ordinance No.6 relating to the School Board, the constitution of School Board requires

Five members nominated by the Academic Council for their special knowledge in any subject assigned to the School or in any allied branch of knowledge; and such other members, but not exceeding five, as may be specified.

Whereas Ordinance No.7 relating to the Department/Centre, Board of Studies, requires:

(a) two teachers of the University who are experts in allied or cognate subject dealt within the Department/ Centre to be nominated by the Academic Council for a period of two years, provided that no such teacher shall be nominated as a member of more than two Departments/Centers.

(b) not more than two persons, not engaged in teaching/research in the University and having expert knowledge of the subject or subjects dealt within the Department/Centre, to be nominated by the Academic Council as members of the Board of Studies concerned for a period of two years.

Accordingly, the matter is placed before the House to recommend nominations for various School Boards and Department/Centre Boards of Studies as per the list of Schools and Centres Annexed.

Resolution 28:

The Registrar brought to the notice of the House that, Boards of Studies of many Schools and Centres are due for reconstitution and the respective Deans and Chairpersons have written to the University requesting reconstitution and Notification of reconstituted Boards as per the Provisions of Ordinance-6 and Ordinance-7 pertaining to the constitution of School and Centre Boards respectively. The Academic Council has to nominate five external subject experts to the Schools Boards and two external experts as well as two internal experts from the allied and cognate subjects to the Centre Boards.

The House unanimously resolved to authorize Hon'ble Vice Chancellor to nominate members to the School Board and Centre Board of Studies on behalf of Academic Council.

Item No.29/14/AC/06.03.2017

To consider request from Director General of Military Training (MoD) for academic collaboration with proposed School of National Security Studies

The University has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Director General of Military Training, MT-15. IHQ of Ministry of Defence (MoD) (Army) New Delhi. Further, based on the discussion of senior officials of defence services with Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor held on 23rd December 2016, Lt. Col. Shri S.S. Singh, GSO-1, MT-15, vide his letter No. A/85166/4/GS/MT-15, addressed to the Registrar, Central University of Gujarat (CUG), has proposed for :

- Award of PhD degree to the Chair Professor on the research carried out during the tenure of Chair of Excellence.
- Direct PhD program of two years for officers with M.Phil Degree on study leave.

Hence, the matter is placed before the Academic Council to consider and approve the same.

Resolution 29:

The Registrar appraised the House about the MoU with DGMT and its proposal to establish a Chair of Excellence in the School of National Security Studies as considered by this House, vide Agenda Item No. 22. Further he informed the House that the letter No. A/85116/4/GS/MT-15 has one more component i.e. direct Ph.D. programme of 2 years for the Officers of the Army with M.Phil. degree. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor explained the proposal of introducing direct Ph.D. programme of 2 years, its advantages as well as technical issues that need to be addressed in the light of UGC Regulations. Further, he suggested that the University is bound by the Regulations issued by the UGC and cannot violate any provision or conditions laid by the UGC for the award of Degree of Ph.D. and requirements to be fulfilled for the completion of Ph.D. programme according to which the minimum time prescribed is three years. The House was in favour of signing the MoU for establishment of Chair of excellence in Defence Studies with an endowment from the Ministry of Defence and explore the possibilities of Ph.D. Programme for defence personnel for which special provision need to be made at the Ministry level.

The House after debate approved the proposal submitted by the Dean, SIS for establishment of Chair of Excellence in Defence Studies subject to the condition that the Degrees to be awarded will be in compliance with UGC Regulations and necessary provisions being made in the University Ordinances governing award of Ph.D. Degree.

Item No.30/14/AC/06.03.2017

To consider M.A. Programme in Defence and Security Studies in the proposed School of National Security Studies

It is proposed to start M.A. Programme in Defence and Security Studies in the School of National Security Studies. After in principle approval for the Programme, a Syllabus Committee, comprising of experts in the area, will be formed to design syllabus for the programme. The Programme will start once syllabus is approved and additional faculty positions (recruitment process in on) are filled in the Centre.

The matter is placed before the Academic Council for consideration.

Resolution 30:

The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor invited Prof. Sanjay Jha to provide the details of the course proposed to be offered. He explained to the House about initiative proposed by the Ministry of Defence and the applications of the course. He stated that the syllabus committee will be constituted comprising experts from the Defence establishments to frame syllabus and course structure for the programme and the course will be started only after the vacancies in faculty positions are filled up.

Having been convinced about the need and applied significance of the course the Academic Council approved in principle the commencement of the M.A. Programme in Defence and Security Studies in the proposed School of National Security Studies, subject

to compliance with the UGC Regulations and the University Ordinances governing the PG Courses as well as filling up of the existing vacant positions and the posts in School of National Security Studies for the creation of which approval is sought from the UGC.

Item No.31/14/AC/06.03.2017

To consider restructuring five years integrated M.A. Programmes of Centre for German Studies and the Centre for Chinese Studies.

Prof. Alok Kumar Gupta, Dean, School of Language, Literature and Culture Studies has submitted a proposal vide his letters dated 18.10.2016 and 08.12.2016 to be placed before the Academic Council for Restructuring of the existing Five-year Integrated M.A. Program (B.A. and M.A.) offered by the Centre for German Studies and the Centre for Chinese Studies.

The proposal is placed before the Academic Council for consideration.

Resolution 31:

The Registrar while presenting the item requested Prof. Alok Kumar Gupta, Dean, SLL&CS to explain and justify the need for restructuring of five year integrated M.A. Programme in Chinese Studies and German Studies. Prof. Alok Kumar Gupta explained to the House the advantages of having separate UG, PG Programmes in Chinese Studies and German Studies and how it is going to enhance the demand for the course. Shri. Prabhat Kumar, Coordinator of Centre for Chinese Studies stated that just as the Defence Officers can join the M.A. Programme in Chinese Studies directly, others can also be considered for entry to PG Programme, particularly in view of most of the students of integrated programme getting absorbed by the time they complete Graduation Studies, resulting in a very high dropout rates and very few students continuing to complete PG Programme. However, the House was divided as to whether University should continue with UG-PG integrated course or such course with provision for lateral entry to PG Programme or independent UG and PG Programme in Chinese Studies. The members however in favour of providing more options to the students depending on the changing needs and contextual relevance of the Course.

The House approved restructuring integrated M.A. programme of Centre for Chinese Studies and the Centre for German Studies. However, with regard to the admissions to these programmes, the House authorised the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor to decide the intake, as per availability of Teachers and required infrastructure available with the University like classrooms and hostel facilities.

Item No.32/14/AC/06.03.2017

To consider and approve independent and standalone PhD programmes subsequent to approval of the ordinance for the same.

The University, at present, offers M.Phil. – Ph.D. integrated programme in its Schools and Centres. However, proposal have been received from School of Nano Sciences, School of Library and Information Sciences, School of International Studies and a few other centres with recommendation of the respective Boards of Studies for introducing standalone (direct) Ph.D. Programmes.

Further, MOUs signed by the University with other institutions also envisage offering Ph.D. Programmes in different disciplines. Further, it also facilitates pursuing Ph.D. Programme by in-service candidates, for whom enrolling in integrated M.Phil.-Ph.D. course will not be feasible.

Hence, the matter is placed before the Academic Council for consideration subject to the approval of related Ordinances.

Resolution 32:

The Registrar informed the House that standalone Ph.D. has been a long standing demand by Schools and Centres and is being deliberated upon every now and then on many academic fora. The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor invited the Committee which was entrusted with the responsibility of reviewing the Ordinance relating to M.Phil. and Ph.D. Programmes to explain their view and what has been proposed. Dr. Sanjeev Kumar Dubey, on behalf of the Committee explained to the House that the Committee has in fact bifurcated Ordinance No. 11 as 11-A and 11-B dealing with M.Phil.-Ph.D. integrated Programme and standalone M.Phil. Programme respectively, reframed the existing Ordinance-12 relating to direct (standalone) Ph.D. Programme and amended Ordinance-14 relating to award of B.A. (Hons.) Degree Programme and the standalone PG Programme as Ordinance 14-A and Ordinance 14-B. He explained as to how these Ordinance are different from the existing Ordinance-11, 12 and 14. The members, while pointing to the nomenclature of B.A.(Hons.) Degree suggested that it would be proper to name it as only B.A. Degree Programme. The members unanimously approved the suggestion and it was decided to refer to the UG Programme as B.A. Degree Programme.

The House unanimously approved the amendments made to the University Ordinance No. 11, Ordinance No. 12 and Ordinance No. 14 making provision for standalone Bachelor Degree, integrated UG-PG Programme, standalone M.Phil. Programme, integrated M.Phil.-Ph.D. Programme and standalone Ph.D. Programme.

Thus, the University will have the following Ordinances dealing with the Programmes mentioned respectively as stated below:

- 01. Ordinance No. 11-A relating to Master of Philosophy and Doctor of Philosophy (M.Phil-Ph.D) Integrated programme**
- 02. Ordinance No.11-B relating to standalone Master of Philosophy(M.Phil) Programmes**
- 03. Ordinance No. 12 relating to Standalone Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D)**
- 04. Ordinance No.14-A relating to the Award of B.A. Degree.**

Item No.33/14/AC/06.03.2017

To consider and approve award of grace point to students missing M.Phil. degree and admission to Ph.D. in M.Phil./Ph.D. integrated programme.

The University has received requests from students who are rendered ineligible to be awarded M.Phil. Degree or register for Ph.D., being short of qualifying CGPA by a very short margin like less than 0.2. Since, there is no provision for gracing or improvement of performance or for

reevaluation, their academic progression has been hampered after having spent two to three and in some cases about four years. Hence, the proposal for provision of gracing up to a particular grade point has been proposed and placed before the Academic Council for consideration.

Resolution 33:

Hon'ble Vice Chancellor explained to the House the difficulties being faced by the University on account of there being no redressal mechanism available for resolving the grievances of the students leading to helplessness among the faculty and frustration among the students. He explained to the House as to how this situation has proved detrimental as well as difficult to handle by the University Administration. He invited the Controller of Examination to explain to the House the cases in which the students are foregoing the Degrees and are rendered ineligible to proceed to Ph.D. Course due to shortage of CGPA Grade as little as 0.1 or 0.2 as there is no provision for gracing in the University Examination System. Controller of Examination presented the list of those who are not eligible to be awarded M.Phil. Degree and those who are not eligible for admission to Ph.D. on account of CGPA deficit by a small fraction in different Schools and Centres. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor pointed out that in the University Ordinances there is no provision for gracing, no provision for revaluation or challenge valuation, no provision for recounting or showing the paper to the candidates and no provision for improvement of performance by reappearing for the exam and there is no provision for re-exam for failed candidates resulting in a stalemate and students reaching a dead-end before completing their course even after spending three to four years, many a time for genuine reasons beyond their control. The House deliberated on the issues at length and resolved as under.

Having been convinced about the need for provisions of student grievance redressal mechanism, and taking into consideration the common practices prevalent in many Universities, the Academic Council resolved to approve gracing by maximum up to 0.2 in CGPA for the benefit of students who are missing the Degrees or progression to Ph.D. by a miniscule shortage in CGPA as one time measure. Further, since there could be more such cases to be dealt with in future and in view of no grievance redressal mechanism there being available to deal with such issues, the House resolved to make provision for revaluation, improvement of performance, re-examination for the failed candidates and showing the papers to the students on demand in deserving cases. It was resolved to incorporate these provisions in the relevant Ordinances as well as in the examination manual through amendments. Further, it was also resolved to think of delinking progression to the next level in integrated programmes from CGPA requirement.

Additional Agenda

Item No.01/14/AC/06.03.2017

To Consider and Approve introducing M.A. programme in Migration and Diaspora Studies in the Centre for Studies and Research in Diaspora from Academic Year 2017-18.

Dr. Atanu Mohapatra has submitted a proposal to introduce M.A. programme in Migration and Diaspora Studies from the Academic Year 2017-18 along with its Concept Note and Course Structure (Annexed) which is placed before the House for consideration.

The Academic Council is requested to consider initiation of the said programme in the Independent Centre for Studies and Research in Diaspora.

Resolution AA-1

Hon'ble Vice Chancellor suggested to Dr. Atanu Mahapatra to explain his proposal and justify the same. Dr. Atanu Mahapatra brought to the notice of the House that Centre for Studies and Research in Diaspora has till now only M.Phil.-Ph.D. integrated programme and with new regular faculty having joined, the Centre has scope for introducing PG Course which could also justify the posts sanctioned and filled with increased workload. Further, the course proposed to be offered being multidisciplinary in content and applied in nature could attract students across the disciplines.

The House approved in principle the introduction of MA Programme in Migration and Diaspora Studies in the Centre for Studies and Research in Diaspora from the Academic Year 2017-18. The House further approved the course structure and syllabus subject to formal approval by the Centre Board of Studies and its being compliant with the University Ordinances and UGC Guidelines.

Item No.02/14/AC/06.03.2017

To Consider and Approve commencing of Ph.D. programme in the Centre for Applied Chemistry, School of Applied Material Science.

Dr. Prakash C. Jha, Associate Professor and Chairperson, Centre for Applied Chemistry, School of Applied Material Science has proposed to start Ph.D. programme in the Centre for Applied Chemistry. The request is placed before the House for consideration.

Resolution AA-2

The House was informed that two new Assistant Professors have reported Centre for Applied Chemistry and there is demand for Ph.D. Programme in Applied Chemistry and Industrial Chemistry in which the Centres specialises itself, particularly from the students who have completed Master's Course in the subject from this University.

The Academic Council approved in principle the introduction of standalone Ph.D. in Applied Chemistry in the School of Applied Material Sciences w.e.f. the Academic Year 2017-18 in compliance with the UGC Regulations.

Item No.03/14/AC/06.03.2017

To consider one-time approval of Ph.D. Thesis submitted under supervision of non-regular faculty members.

The detailed agenda note submitted by the Office of the Controller of Examination is placed before the House for consideration.

Resolution AA-3

The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor invited the Controller of Examination to explain to the Members in brief the gist of the resolution placed before the House. CoE informed the House that in the light of communications received from UGC as well as the conditions stipulated in the revised UGC Regulations published on 5th May, 2016, the Contractual Faculty, Guest/Visiting/Adjunct Faculty are not eligible to supervise M.Phil.-Ph.D. candidates. In view of the above, the Office of the CoE is not accepting such theses/dissertations that are not compiled under the supervision of regular faculty putting the students to hardship for reasons beyond their control owing to uncertainty of validity of their Degrees. The House was informed that due to non-availability of senior regular faculty during the inception of the University which was further impacted by suspension of its Ordinances, the students admitted to M.Phil.-Ph.D. Courses were allotted to contractual, adjunct, visiting, adhoc and guest faculty between 2010 to 2014. Further, the University has also awarded M.Phil.-Ph.D. Degrees to a few students under the supervision of non-regular faculty who were admitted during 2011-12, keeping in view the interest of the students and in order to render the Degrees awarded by the University legitimate, the matter was placed before the Academic Council to approve these Degrees as being in order and legitimate as one time measure.

The House perused the list of candidates who were admitted to M.Phil.-Ph.D. Programmes and allotted non-regular faculty as Supervisors between 2010 and 2014 and had been awarded the Degrees and those who have submitted their M.Phil./Ph.D. dissertations/theses under such Supervisors from Schools of Life Science, Chemical Sciences, Environment and Sustainable Development and Comparative Literature and Translation Studies. Considering the context and conditions under which such supervisors were allotted as exceptional cases, the House resolved to validate and legitimatise the Degrees awarded and to be awarded to the candidates mentioned in the list as a one-time measure.

Application of old grading system for Army Candidates of MA in Chinese Studies.

The House was informed about a note submitted by Controller of Examination seeking clarification regarding which grading system should be made applicable to the Army Candidates who have joined M.A. in Chinese Studies Course for the Academic Year 2016-17 under MoU between Central University of Gujarat and the Directorate of Military Training of Indian Army, Ministry of Defence.

Resolution AA-4

It was brought to the notice of the House that the Army Candidates have joined 7th Semester directly through lateral entry and at present for 7th Semester batch the old grading system is applicable which was applicable, which was in vogue till 2014-15 when, the 12th Plan Guidelines of UGC grading system for CBCS were adopted by University. The Army candidates have joined 2013-14 batch of students in the year 2016-17. Since new grading system is in operation from 2015-16 batch onwards, the University had to take a decision as to which grading system should be made applicable to the Army Candidates. On being referred for advice and directions, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, considering this as a special case of lateral entry being offered for the first time to Army Candidates under the MoU with Ministry of Defence, had decided that old grading system be made applicable to the Army Candidates, though they have joined in the year 2016-17 because for one batch of students there cannot be two different grading systems applicable. The decision so taken, was suggested to be taken to the Academic Council for ratification by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor.

Hence, the decision taken by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor is placed before the Academic Council for ratification.

The House having been convinced about the circumstances under which the decision was taken and having found it rational, justified and warranted, ratified the decision taken by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor.

The Registrar with the permission of the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor placed before the House the request submitted by the M.Sc. Students of School of Environment and Sustainable Development for providing opportunity to visit Institutes like NEERI, VRC, IARI, CEE, etc. for their dissertation/research work during 4th Semester which would provide them much needed experience and exposure and enhance employability. They have claimed that this would provide them with industrial and scientific exposure as well as dynamics of the field. Their demand is to have only dissertation work during the 4th Semester with no theory papers which require them to be on the campus owing to attendance requirement. They have further offered and suggested that the three theory papers of 4th Semester could be adjusted in the first three semesters so that the total credits will remain the same.

Resolution AA-5

The House discussed about the same and authorised the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor to initiate appropriate action in the matter after taking the opinion of the concerned Dean, since the proposal submitted by the students was found to be justified as it would provide opportunities for the students to work with reputed research institutions and industrial establishments and provide much needed exposure and hands-on experience.

With no other issue being raised by the Hon'ble members for discussion, the 14th meeting of the Academic Council was concluded with the Registrar thanking the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor for presiding over the deliberations of the meeting and steering it to arrive at important decisions and resolutions of long lasting implications. He also thanked the Hon'ble members, particularly the nominated members namely, Prof. R. G. Sonkawade, Prof. C. N. Krishna Naik, Prof. Ali Raza Moosvi, Prof. Malabika Deo and Prof. H. C. Sardar who had made it convenient to attend the meeting travelling long distances and for enriching the deliberations of the meeting through inciteful inputs. The Registrar also thanked all the Deans, Professors, faculty and student representatives who were present as the members of Academic Council. Further, he thanked the Finance Officer and the Controller of Examination who were present as the Special Invitees for providing requisite information and clarification on the issues raised in the deliberations. Finally, he thanked the supporting staff for their help and assistance in conducting the meeting. The members reciprocating with gratitude thanked Chairperson of the Academic Council.
