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About Central University Of Gujarat



Introduction

The Central University of Gujarat (CUG) was established by an Act of Parliament in the year 2009 with its jurisdiction over the entire state of Gujarat; rendering human service to the cause of higher education by catering to the academic, intellectual and professional needs of the youth of the state of Gujarat and across the country. To this extent, it is contributing its might in generating and providing requisite human resources that India needs to emerge as a vibrant knowledge society. The University was ranked overall 60^{th} in India and 2^{nd} among all the universities in Gujarat in NIRF 2016 ranking. The University had a NAAC visit in September 2016 and was awarded B++ rating.

Motto

The main motto of the University is providing a global platform for knowledge and employability to the students of the University through society and industry interface.

Mission

The mission of CUG is to provide access to quality education and create opportunities for encouraging students to effectively engage with emerging innovations and technological challenges, international competitiveness and leadership in thought as well as in action. CUG is also conscious of the importance of developing entrepreneurial and scholastic abilities for creation of knowledge, wealth and prosperity for the country as well as peace and happiness for human beings.

Vision

The vision of CUG is to establish itself as a centre of excellence with social commitment by integrating modern, scientific and technological knowledge and skills with the basic human ethos and values. The University shall set forth a model in teaching, research and personality development and create skilled human resource with a sense of responsiveness towards society, the country and the world at large.

Objectives

- Dissemination and advancement of knowledge by providing instructional and research facilities in various branches of learning.
- Making special provisions for integrated courses in humanities, social sciences, science and technology in educational programmes.
- Taking appropriate measures for promoting innovations in teaching-learning methods and interdisciplinary training and research.
- Educating and training human resource for the country's development.
- Establishing academic-industry partnership to promote advancements in science and technology.
- Paying special attention to the improvement of social and economic conditions and welfare of the people, especially pertaining to their intellectual, academic and cultural development.
- ➤ Ensuring improvement of socio-economic conditions of people, through intellectual, academic and cultural development.

Academic Structure and Curricular Aspects

Central University of Gujarat presently has eight Schools and two independent Centres. There are thirteen Centres within these Schools covering multidisciplinary subjects ranging from Languages, Humanities, Social Sciences and Sciences. Currently three integrated Master's programmes, fourteen stand-alone Master's



programmes and thirteen M.Phil. - Ph. D integrated programmes are being offered by the University. Some Schools are also offering direct Ph.D. admissions. The University has made concerted efforts to enhance its excellence in teaching, research and extension activities.

The course content of academic programmes is designed to cater to the needs of its stakeholders by providing extended horizon. The structure of every curriculum includes ICT enabled innovative teaching and learning, laboratory experiments (where ever applicable), presentations, in-house seminars, assignments, self-study and dissertations.

Efforts are constantly on with redesigning courses keeping in view the changing priorities of technology, industry, as well as methods of imparting knowledge and its implementation. These initiatives of updating and upgrading are undertaken by the Centre and School Boards of Studies, with inputs from distinguished external members drawn from premier academic and scientific institutions across the country to provide cutting edge exposure and advantage to the courses being offered by the University. This makes the graduates globally competitive with emphasis on employability and social and economic relevance in terms of national priorities. Having introduced Choice Based Credit System scheme right since its inception, the University has incorporated much desired academic flexibility in its courses with ample scope for inter and intra disciplinary choices of courses across the Schools and Centres, in the form of core compulsory, core elective and foundation courses.

The University has a formal mechanism in place to elicit student feedback on course structure and content. The analysis of feedback from students combined with observations and inputs from external experts provide basis for refining, revising and updating the curricula and pedagogy. In consonance with objectives and obligations stated in the document of its establishment, the University offers courses and undertakes research in areas like internal security, national security, social management, innovation policy, social engineering, diaspora studies, cancer biology, computational chemistry, material science, nano science, industrial chemistry, climate change, eco-sustainability, providing an innovative edge to Central University of Gujarat. Even while operating in these unchartered academic territories, the University constantly updates and upgrades its curricula to tune it to the changing needs and pressing priorities of Indian society. With approval from the Ministry of Human Resources Development, the University proposes to offer many more professional and applied courses under the Schools of Technology, Earth Science and Remote Sensing, Management, Education, Health, Culture and Personality Development.

Teaching – Learning and Evaluation

The University adopts transparency in all its academic and evaluation process and ensures wide publicity to all available academic programmes. Admission in all programmes offered by the University is made through online entrance test conducted by University itself on all India basis. Central University of Gujarat is the first University among the newly established Central Universities to conduct complete online admissions. The whole process is monitored by Central Admission Committee comprising Controller of Examinations, Deans of the Schools, faculty members from different schools and one member representing members from each category of SC, ST, OBC, Women and Minority. The University organizes orientation programme at the beginning of academic semester for new entrants to apprise them with the University, salient features of the course the student has opted and opportunities after the completion of the course.



Academic calendar is being followed by all Schools and all possible measures are being adopted to make the learning process student centric. Most of the teaching-learning methodologies are ICT based and e-learning facility through LAN connectivity is easily accessible to the students round the clock. The faculty members ensure a culture of creativity among the learners.

Teachers are encouraged to participate in prestigious international and national academic activities. These events enable them to interact with eminent academia.

The University follows a transparent and standard system of examinations by evaluating the progress of the students through continuous internal assessment at the Centre/School level and the end semester examinations conducted by the Office of Controller of Examinations. UGC guidelines are followed for the evaluation of the students.

Research and Extension

Research has been the mainstay of the University and many Schools and Centres offer research programmes with interdisciplinary approach. Research infrastructure available in the University is the best in Western India and one of the best in India. A central facility known as Central Instrumentation Facility (CIF) has been established with state-of-the-art research facility. The University has immense potential and promise to support the research in frontier areas of science disciplines. It hosts a wide range of instruments including chromatography, spectroscopy and microscopy with instruments like XRD, NMR and MALDI - TOF. Such a diverse availability of instruments not only enhances the exposure, but also encourages researchers to explore challenging research activities. CIF has been supporting research in Life Sciences, Chemical Sciences, Environmental Sciences and Nano Science and has the potential to support research in many other branches of sciences that are proposed in the near future such as Applied Material Science, Earth Science and Remote Sensing Technology. School of Chemical Sciences, School of Life Sciences, School of Environment and Sustainable Development, and School of Nano Sciences of the university have gained eminence as the centres of national repute with state of art laboratories having very sophisticated and advanced equipment for executing advanced level scientific research.

Schools and Special Centres have a Committee of Advanced Studies and Research (CASR) comprising of Dean of the School as the Chairperson of the Committee, Chairperson/s of the Centre in the School and all eligible supervisors. This Committee plans, monitors and evaluates the M. Phil and Ph.D. programmes offered by the School/Centre. The CASR is responsible for the M.Phil. and Ph.D. related matters such as acceptance of the research proposals submitted by the scholars, approval of the supervisors and title of the dissertation and/or thesis of the scholars.

The University endeavours to promote research work among young and aspiring faculty members. University provides grants to such young researchers. The University has constituted an independent Project cell to support such and all other project related activities. The objective is to:

- Encourage and support proposal submissions in various subjects.
- Simplify procedures related to sanctions/purchases made by the investigators.
- Ensure sharing of overhead charges between University and School/Centre to further support the research initiative by the researchers.



- Ensure timely release of grants.
- Ensure timely audit and submission of utilization certificate to the funding authorities.

Adjunct Professors are an asset to the University in terms of sharing their knowledge and exposure. The University invites adjunct faculty members from the institutes and Universities of national and international repute. They also support University as joint supervisors for Ph. D and M. Phil thesises. The involvement of adjunct professors in University has promoted interdisciplinary research. Furthermore, students' research is facilitated at multiple institutes/universities.


Extension and Outreach Activities

One of the components of higher education in which the University seeks to excel is the extension activities. Having committed itself to taking the campus to the Community and putting scholarship generated and technology innovated to address some of the pressing issues facing the society, the University has been viewed as harbinger of positive social transformation. Courses in Rational Drug Design, Climate Change, and Sustainable Development are viewed as endowed with potential to improve the social and physical quality of life of people on the one hand and generate human resources that could be in the reckoning for social engineering. Several MoUs signed by Schools and Centres have the potential to enrich the extension profile of the University. The MoUs signed by Computational Chemistry Group with leading scientific/research laboratories at KTH, Stockholm and University of Uppsala, Sweden, Colorado University, Village Adoption under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, School Adoption Programme, B.Voc. programme of University Grants Commission could be cited as a few initiatives to strengthen extension profile of the University. The University has signed a MoU with Adivasi Academy and Bhasha Research and Publications, Tejgadh.



The University Industry Interface Cell, and the B. 






Subject wise Distribution of Students Appeared in Entrance Test 2016-17






State-wise Percentage Distribution of Students Appeared in the Entrance Test 2016-17





Gender Distribution of Students Admitted








Distribution of Teaching Staff





Gender Distribution of Teaching Staff






Social Representation of Teaching Staff

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The University operates from a transit campus situated in the premises of two government schools in Sector 29 and Sector 30. However, it has spared no efforts in providing the best possible learning and research infrastructure to its students and faculty members. Due to scarcity of space, emphasis has been on the quality and on intensity. Well-equipped and furnished classrooms, state-of-the-art laboratories, well stacked library render the University an academic and scientific organisation.

Spacious classrooms in the University provide a conducive atmosphere for dynamic and focused discussions. They are equipped with integrated LCD Projectors, audio–visual teaching aids for lectures, presentations etc. Special sessions and remedial coaching classes are conducted for spoken English, NET-SET exams, leadership, teamwork and analytical skills.

There are four conference halls in the University with 50 to 250 seating capacity for conferences and other events. There are two other seminar halls. All these halls are equipped with advanced presentation tools for various programs.

The University has over 10 state-of-the-art science laboratories that allow the students to experiment theory. All Schools and Centres are connected through a highly secure virtual private network, where devices are connected through 1 GBPS broadband connection. Both campuses have state-of-the-art computer network with Wi-Fi that provide computing facilities comprising of the latest computers linked to a wide range of software, communication and print service. CUG is fully wireless and students in many programs are provided with computers to help them to access the Internet anytime, anywhere. Latest software is used to enable work on data analysis, CAD, CAM for laboratories and libraries. The intranet enables close on-line interaction between faculty and students.

The University provides guest house facility including a VIP Guest House for the visiting faculty members and other officials who visit the University on various assignments. The University has hired three spacious apartments and furnished them for this purpose.

Wi-Fi and ICT Facility


The University is Wi-Fi enabled and students can access the internet using a personal id and password provided by the University. This connectivity is through NMEICT and BSNL providers.

Central Library

The Central Library is accessible through the campus wide Ethernet network. The Library has a Learning Centre for the Visually Challenged where Braille Software has been exclusively installed. Additional softwares like Kurzwell, Sara CE, Jiffy Scanner are also available. Currently, the library has subscribed 66 journals and magazines and over 8903+ e-journals. Prominent among them are subscribed through e-Shodhsindhu, Consortium for Higher Education and electronic resources. There are about 32,450 books and 2,800 e-books, and has more than one lakh e-content material/ books/journals. To ensure security of books and self-check in and self-check out, the circulation desk at the Library is equipped with RFID technology. The Library portal is being strengthened regarding better navigation to facilitate access from both the campuses. Central Library also provides off campus access through ezproxy software of e-journals and databases.

Virtual Learning Resource Centre (VLRC)

The Virtual Learning Resource Centre (VLRC) is a web-based information retrieval service. It provides/enables electronic information access through the CUG Library website. This is a centre for all electronic and edatabases, Library OPAC and reference material can also be accessed through this interface. VLRC provides internet access to students to access the electronic resources, e-databases, Educational Video Services and has a Language Lab for English, German and Chinese Studies.

Health Facility

Medical facility is available to the staff and students from the clinic adjacent to the University Campus. In addition, the Government Civil Hospital is located near the University. Earn While You Learn Scheme

The Earn While You Learn Initiative is a unique scheme in the University to aid students of undergraduate and postgraduate level programmes who do not receive fellowships. The initiative is particularly meant for those students who come from financially and socially disadvantaged sections of the society to support them during their stay at the University. As a part of the initiative, the students are assigned duties in the University Cyber Library after the classroom hours. The University intends to increase the scope of this scheme to include other University duties as well. Special care is taken for women students who are allotted convenient timings.

Means-cum-Merit Scholarship

The University is working to offer means-cum-merit scholarship for the students of undergraduate and postgraduate streams of the University soon.

Remedial English Programme

The Remedial English Programme is a UGC supported initiative meant for the students belonging to deprived and minority groups in order to help them enhance their communication skills in English.

Games and Sports

The University organises sports and games programmes that are combined with the students' academic pursuits. In view of the space constraints, basic sports facilities are available on the campus. It has also tied up with Sports Authority of India (SAI), Gandhinagar for sports facilities.

Cultural Activities

Cultural activities among the student community on the campus are promoted through various cultural clubs. Students are encouraged to participate in various cultural activities.

Admission and Evaluation



Introduction

Admission and Evaluation department acts as a gateway to the students' entry in the University, and exit after completion of his/her study in a programme. The activities of the department are orientated towards students' academic life cycle and progression in the University. The department conducts all-India computer-based, online Entrance test at various centres across the country.

Admissions in 2016-17 at a glance

As per the direction of the UGC to all Central Universities to adopt online entrance test for admissions to various programmes, the University had conducted all-India computer-based online entrance test during the academic year 2016-17. The University has conducted its national level entrance test completely in online format for two years in a row.

The time line of the entrance test was declared with the commencement of the admission notification. For the Academic year 2016-17, the all-India computer-based online entrance test was conducted at 33 different centres across the country. There were a total of 2,240 applicants, of which 1393 (62.2%) appeared in the entrance test while 847 (37.8%) were absent. Of the total 1393 appeared candidates, the merit lists were prepared for different centres of studies and a total of 193 new students were admitted against declared vacancy of 296 in the University during the Academic year 2016-17. The maximum number of students admitted in 2016-17 were from Gujarat (67) followed by Uttar Pradesh (25), West Bengal (22), Bihar (13), and Odisha (10).



The School of Social Sciences was established in 2009. This school thrives to maintain its tradition of excellence by means of building innovative models, use of robust measures as well as effective methodologies to understand human behaviour and existence in a diverse and digital era.

The vision of the School is to bring together scholars using eclectic approaches ranging from formal to interpretative and qualitative to quantitative to tackle fundamental research questions and offer solutions to pressing social issues. The School is incessantly forging various interdisciplinary connections to explore and develop sound understanding of economic, social, psychological and cultural factors that impact adoption of policies, framing of regulations, issues related to human behaviour.

The School is multidisciplinary in scope and is open to innovative methodologies for explorations and research in social sciences.

Extension, outreach and other similar activities undertaken

Field work is an integral part of the M.A. and M. Phil programme. So, in the last year, students were exposed to complex social realties through field work in three phases.

- 1. Field work was conducted between April 25 and April 26, 2016 in a slum called "Vadaj" in Gandhinagar Ahmedabad, Gujarat. Students of M.A. in Sociology (2015-16 Batch), M.A. in Society and Development (2014-15 Batch) and M.Phil. programmes (2015-16 Batch) made observations and conducted informal interviews in these localities. An NGO called "Manav Sadhna" was part of the study. This field study was done under the guidance of Dr. Asima Jena, Dr. Khaikholen Haokip and Dr. Madhumita Biswal.
- 2. Field work was conducted on November 19, 2016 in a slum called "Kachchha Chapra", opposite to Gandhi Ashram, Ahmedabad, Gujarat. Students of M.A. in Sociology (2016-17 Batch) and M.Phil. programmes (2016-17 Batch) made observations and conducted informal interviews in these localities.

School of Language, Literature and Culture Studies

School of Language, Literature and Culture Studies (SLL&CS) runs post-graduate and research programmes in various subjects related to Humanities such as the study of Indian and foreign languages and comparative study of literatures and cultures. Issues related to gender, caste, race and processes of exclusion and marginalization in society, questions related to migration and identity of diaspora communities form some of the core areas of study in the courses offered by the School. All the programmes are interdisciplinary and innovative in nature and prepare students for employment in teaching, research, print and visual media, administration, publishing, editing and emerging areas such as technical writing and content development.

The programmes offered in the School follows the Choice Based Credit System. Attendance in the classroom is compulsory for under-graduate, post-graduate courses as well as the course work of the M.Phil. - Ph.D. programme. Class-room lectures are designed to ensure students' participation and involvement. Teachers also use seminars, workshops and films to impart instruction. Students must submit assignments, projects and papers regularly as part of their coursework. They are also required to make presentations/give seminars on topics related to their subjects. Students' participation in the class-room is given special weightage in evaluation. All the centres of the School arrange lectures by learned experts and hold workshops and seminars on new fields/areas of the subject.

As a subject, it has great relevance in a multi-lingual society like India. Comparative Literature allows students to explore research areas in the core subjects of thematology, genealogy, literary history, literary influence, and reception, besides related fields of performance studies, theatre studies, film studies etc. It goes beyond mere comparative study of texts to include issues of nation, caste, race, gender, region, culture etc. in the analysis of texts. The relation between orality and literacy as well as issues related to the history of print and publishing also form topics studied under the rubric of Comparative Literature.

Centre For German Studies

The Centre for German Studies (CGS) was started in 2011 with the objective of expanding knowledge, learning and research on German language, literature and culture in India and contributing to India's close links with Germany. The Centre offers a Bachelor as well as Master degree in German Studies. Candidates who have passed 10+2 (AISSCE) are eligible for admission to the Bachelor Program (B.A. Hons.) in German Language and Literature. After completion of B.A., students have an option of either pursuing an MA in German Language and Literature or working as German language experts. Courses are designed in accordance with The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). Teaching methodology adapted by the Centre for German Studies is interactive and student-centric which gives students enough space for personal as well as intellectual growth. Centre for Studies in Sindhi Language and Literature

In accordance with the MoU, the Centre will be funded through the interest generated from a corpus fund. Prof. Sanjeev Kumar Dubey has been appointed as the Chairperson of the Centre. The Centre offers a training programme for teachers of Sindhi language. In addition to this, a diploma course is also offered in translation studies. The Centre will also organise seminars and workshops for promotion of Sindhi language and literature.

A seminar titled 'Learning and Teaching of Sindhi Language in Gujarat: Challenges and Opportunities' was held by the Centre on May 25th, 2016. Mrs. Aruna Jethwani, Vice-President of National Council for Promotion of Sindhi Language, was the chief guest of this event. Many eminent scholars in Sindhi language and literature participated in the seminar.



School of International Studies

The School has been conceptualised to encourage diversity in the constitution of knowledge of international affairs in India. Its current focus is on creating new and relevant knowledge in the core International Relation areas such as International Politics and Security Studies. In the coming years, the School intends to pursue research in history, theory and sociology of modern India's international relations and all areas of Security Studies. Aware of the Gujarat's historical connections with the larger world, it will pursue research on maritime influences on India's trade, culture and security. These relatively new areas would be pursued alongside more conventional research areas such as International Relations Theories, International Organisations, International Trade and Development, International Law, and Globalisation. Founded as Centre for Internal Security in 2009, it was renamed as Centre for Security Studies in 2012. It also intends to foster a link between widest spectrum of stakeholders like, academics, military personnel, think tanks and policy makers.

Annual Report of IQAC for the Academic Session-2016-17

The IQAC prepared the Self Study Report (SSR) for the University as per the proforma provided by National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Bangalore, which comprised of seven criteria namely, 1. Curriculum Aspects; 2. Teaching, Learning and Evaluation; 3. Research, Consultancy and Extension; 4. Infrastructure and Learning Resource; 5. Student Support and Progression; 6. Governance, Leadership and Management; 7. Innovation and Best Practices. The SSR was uploaded to the website of CUG with a proper link. On the basis of SSR, the NAAC constituted a Peer Team Committee to visit CUG. The dates of visit were $26^{th} - 29^{th}$ September, 2016.

After that, the Peer Team visited all the Schools/Centres, Library, Infrastructure facilities, General Administrative and Finance Section, Examination Section and had a detailed interaction with Deans, Chairpersons, Coordinators and Officers of the concerned School/Centres/Sections. They also had interactive sessions with Students, Research Scholars, Non-teaching staff, Parents and Alumni. A cultural programme was also organised on 26th September 2016.

On the last day of the Peer Team Visit i.e. on 29th September 2016 an Exit Meeting was organised in which the Chairman of the Peer Team presented the report to Hon'ble Vice Chancellor. Later on the NAAC declared the Peer Team Visit results and CUG was awarded NAAC Grade B++.

Remedial Coaching cell for SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer) and Minority Community

Objectives of the Cell

- Improve the academic skills and linguistic proficiency of the students in various subjects
- To raise their level of comprehension of basic subjects to provide a stronger foundation for further academic work.

School Adoption Programme

For this, in line with the vision of Central University of Gujarat (CUG) to establish itself as a Centre of Excellence with social commitment and creating skilled human resource with a sense of responsiveness towards society, the country and the world at large, the University undertook a project from March 2015 and initiated support activities to develop the skills of students in the Government Primary School in Sector 29, Gandhinagar



The project is co-ordinated by Dr. Ishmeet Kaur, Assistant Professor, Centre for English Studies, SLL& CS in close consultation with Dr. Litty Denis, Assistant Professor Chairperson, Centre for Studies in Social Management, SSS, Co-ordination Extension and Outreach Activities and Co-ordinator Village Adoption Programme.

Students of various Schools at the University enthusiastically engaged with the tiny learners to equip them with various skills. This was part of the project to understand the physical themselves and social dimensions of the school and also to prepare the students of the University to assist the school children.

Village Adoption Programme

The Central University of Gujarat (CUG) envisions establishing itself as a centre of excellence with social commitment and creating skilled human resource with a sense of responsiveness towards society, the country and the world at large. In line with this vision and the Visitor's mandate that each Central University should adopt at least five villages, the University has decided to undertake a 'Village Adoption Programme'.

Activities undertaken

- Since the strength lies in education, the students of CUG are engaging with the children studying in the government primary school who can be the agents of change in future.
- A group of students are studying the problem of water in the village and are working out possible solutions to provide them with safe drinking water.
- Another group of students are working on providing solutions to the problem of the village farmers to have a decent warehouse to store their yield post-harvest so that they do not have to sell it at a very low price.







Central University of Gujarat and Unnat Bharat Abhiyan

Central University of Gujarat has an active cell for Village Adoption Programme which functions for rural development and inclusive growth in line with the guidelines of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA), the flagship programme of MHRD, Govt. of India. The University believes strongly that higher academic institutions can bring a transformation in the rural areas by working closely with the State and local communities. At the University, the students, faculty members and non-teaching staff participate in the programme actively and contribute to the mission.

In line with the vision of the University, the 'Village Adoption Programme' commenced in 2015, which was subsequently considered as a part of the UBA for the CUG. It was decided that since the University is still in an infant stage, initially under the programme only one village was adopted and all stakeholders of the University contribute towards making the village a model village. Subsequently the University could extend the programme to more number of villages as feasible.

Through active support of the State Government, CUG first adopted a village named Kaka nu Tarapur in Gandhinagar district. The extension works at Kaka nu Tarapur is being supervised by Prof. M.H. Fulekar, Dean, School of Environment and Sustainable Development in order to develop an Eco-village primarily with the objective of transferring technology from Lab to Land.

The University had also started development oriented work through the Centre for Studies in Social Management, in a small village Ambethi in the Dholka Taluka of Ahmedabad district (village code 511717, Census 2011). Under the Village Adoption Programme, the cell had begun implementing certain programmes like safe-drinking water programme, workshops on health, hygiene and environment related programmes in the previous year. But the distance to this village was too long (86 Kms) and hence it became difficult to sustain the momentum of the activities.

Therefore, the University is now planning to adopt a village in the vicinity so that the activities are sustainable in the long run. The University is working out on the detailed plan to adopt another village near the campus in



order to undertake development works as per the guidelines of the *Unnat Bharat Abhiyaan (UBA)*. The following village has been proposed: Sonipur, Block Gandhinagar, District Gandhinagar (village code 511250, Census, 2011).

The Central University of Gujarat is still in its transit campus. Hence, it may not be a good idea to go ahead with five villages at the moment. It has been discussed and agreed upon that some more villages could be adopted under UBA once the University moves into its permanent campus.

Meanwhile, the University is also working closely with a primary school just opposite to the current campus since two years now under the School Adoption Programme. This programme focusses on giving remedial coaching to the students in English language, Mathematics, sports and Computers. CUG has donated 12 computers to the school laboratory and aids the school in equipping the students to gain basic computer skills. Also, the University has established a vocational centre at the school by providing sewing machines and supporting them in training the students in sewing with the objective to train them for enhancing livelihood opportunities in future.

These are a few initiatives taken by CUG in the past two years through the Extension and Outreach Cell. The University intends to scale this up by entering an MOU with the UBA- Co-ordinating institute. For now, the University would like to wait till adoption of the village is completed formally and then work can be taken up in a planned manner in the villages under the *Unnat Bharat Abhiyaan*.

University Industry Interface Cell (UIIC)

Better interaction between University and Industry is the need of hour. Through this cell the students are sent to get industry exposure. As we know, there is an urgent need of interaction of industry and academics where the University can prepare students for jobs in multinational companies and industry will also be benefited by possibility of receiving a well-trained workforce. To make it a reality, bridging the gap between industry and the University is a must and for this, an Industry Interaction Cell (IIIC) was established in 2015.

Objectives of UIIC

UIIC is making an effort to cultivate the strong links with the industry by involving faculty members and students. UIIC cell also invites Industry personnel for interaction between them and our faculty members. Workshop/Conferences are jointly organised. The long-term goal of UIIC is to enable academics to take a sabbatical in industries; provide internships for students in industries, which will prepare the students better for entering the industry. The mandate of UIIC is to create an industrial chair in the university; and to enable the appointment of experienced industry resource persons as visiting faculty. UIIC is also actively involved in bringing about MOU'S and Agreements with various industrial and research organizations in different fields and sectors to promote various forms of interactions.



Yoga Club

Yoga Club was inaugurated on 11th April 2016 at Sector-30 camps by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Central University of Gujarat. In this event, the Registrar, Chairperson (YPIC), DSW and many faculty members along with approximately hundred scholars and students also participated in the inauguration ceremony. Inauguration was followed by Yoga demonstration by Yoga Instructor Mr. Alok Kumar Pandey.

Objectives

- 1- To enable the students to build self-discipline and self-control leading to immense amount of awareness, concentration and higher level of consciousness.
- 2- To develop spiritual-cum-scientific personality of the students.
- 3- To develop an understanding and the interrelationship between mind & body and acquire the training of mental, physical and emotional balance.

Central Library



Central Library is rapidly building up to be one of leading professional research and professional libraries in the world. All the bibliographic details of books, ebooks, journals, Online Databases are accessible through the campus wide Ethernet network. CUG Campus Sector-30, and 29 campus and school/centres and office of the University are connected to the Library through Intranet/Internet.Central Library has installed exclusively for Visually Challenged students to access Braile Software, Kurzwell, Sara CE, Jiffy Scanner. Central Library has created Learning Centre for Visually Challenged.

During the current year library has subscribed 66 journals and magazines are subscribed. Prominent among them are subscribed through e-ShodhSindhu: Consortium for Higher Education Electronic Resources. It holds about 32450 books and 2800 ebooks, and subscribes to over 66print/online scholarly journals and magazines and over 8903+ e-journals and also central subscribed more than one lac econtent on SAGE Research Methods Online access facility to users. The library uses Koha software for library operations and services. All the library operations like circulation, acquisition, journal subscriptions, cataloguing, online catalogue etc. are being managed using this software.


